## APPENDIX

### DEFINITIONS

Community-based non-specialised services (category 3). This includes community-based non-specialized services (incl. NGOs) which may target special needs of children of prisoners. It includes all services providing support or counselling for troubled children or adolescents. It solely includes services troubled children or adolescents can seek support and counselling at and excludes services support or counselling cannot be initiated by children or adolescents themselves as well as services targeting parents, grand-parents or other carers only. This definition includes interventions provided by the services' staff within the prison. Telephone hotlines and internet-based hotlines that are directly provided by community-based non-specialised services are included; hotlines that are not directly provided by community-based non-specialised services are excluded. Also excluded are chat forums and other peer-to-peer social media as they are not provided by community-based non-specialised services.

Mental health services for children and adolescents (category 4). This includes, in accord with Johnson et al. (2000), all services that aim on the management of mental illness and of the clinical and social difficulties related to it. This definition excludes facilities not specializing in mental health care; it also excludes services which may be important for many mentally ill children and adolescents but do not target their specific needs.

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### METHOD OF IDENTIFICATION

How to identify community-based non-specialised services for families of prisoners:

- Identify all kinds of services that might meet the criteria for being included into our mapping, e.g., in Germany, youth welfare offices; parenting support centres; school psychologists etc.
- Contact a small number of services of each kind of services and explore whether inclusion criteria are met
- If inclusion criteria are met: Assess the number of existing services in an efficient though reliable manner
- If necessary: Collect further information about the services' interventions.

How to identify mental health services for children or adolescents:

- Identify all kinds of services that might meet the criteria for being included into our mapping, e.g., in Germany, psychiatric hospitals for children and adolescents; psychiatrists in private practice etc.
- Assess the number of existing services and estimate their treatment capacity on basis of data provided by e.g. statistical reports of relevant health care associations (in Germany e.g. by the Federal Statistical Office, the Association of Statutory Health Insurance Physicians etc.)



## **CHECKLIST Community-based non-specialised services for families of prisoners**

### **Inclusion criteria (all must be ticked)**

- Community-based
- Non-specialized
- The service provides support or counselling for troubled children or adolescents
- The service may target special needs of children of prisoners
- Children or adolescents can seek support and counselling on their own initiative

### **Please note that this includes interventions**

- that are provided by the services' staff within the prison
- like telephone hotlines and internet-based hotlines are directly provided by the service

### **but NOT**

- hotlines that are not directly provided by community-based non-specialised services
- chat forums and other peer-to-peer social media as they are not provided directly by community-based non-specialised services as defined

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## **CHECKLIST Mental health services for children and adolescents**

### **Inclusion criteria**

- Services aim on the management of mental illness and of clinical and social difficulties related to mental illness

(i.e. child and adolescent psychiatric outpatient services, day patient services, inpatient service such as child psychiatric hospitals and departments, child and adolescents (pediatric) psychiatric day care hospitals, related specialized outpatient units, child psychiatrists, child psychotherapists)

### **but NOT**

- Not specialized in mental health care
- Not targeting specific needs of mentally ill children or adolescents
